Before the end of the spring term the College was able to confirm plans for students on practical and practice-based subjects to return to campus for teaching that cannot be completed online. However, for the remainder of students, face-to-face teaching will not begin until at least 17 May. The College is committed to supporting all students, including our Bedford Society Scholars, through to the successful completion of this year's studies.

Roger Eastwood (Botany 1978)

Elizabeth Aylward (Philosophy 1982)

I was teaching full time and had a young family so opted for a weekly essay and exams, one of the two choices available to me at that time. Jonathan Sant (Mathematics 1984) "The bell that cried wolf"

Early in the 1980s the alarms at Bedford College were tested with tremendous zeal: by which I mean very frequently and persistently. There was no drill to be followed, or at least not for the students; we just carried on safe in the knowledge that we were somehow protected by the efficiency of the bells. One particular day when the bells went off, I was in the Herringham hall [...] with a fair view of the main college doors. I was chatting with someone and there were various

'Prorogation?' - Magna Carta Lecture 2021

Monday 7 June, 6.30pm, online event

Speaker: The Right Honourable The Baroness Hale of Richmond DBE PC QC FBA

At a time of heightened political tension surrounding the United Kingdom's withdrawal from the European Union, the Supreme Court of the United Kingdom, presided over by Baroness Hale of Richmond, ruled that the government's prorogation of Parliament was unlawful – a decision that has been described as reaffirming parliamentary sovereignty and having major implications for our system of government.

In the Magna Carta Lecture 2021, almost two years on from the event, Lady Hale will reflect on the events and ruling of 2019.
